AI FORUM 2025

The AI Forum will take place on Thursday 6th November in Croke Park, Dublin. This conference will bring together all the key stakeholders involved in the delivery of Ireland's public services and all those involved in emerging technology across both the public and private sector.

The National Artificial Intelligence Strategy, AI – Here for Good, sets out Ireland's ambition to be an international leader in using AI to benefit our economy and society, through a people-centred, ethical approach to its development, adoption and use. Published in 2021, it was refreshed in 2024 to take into account significant developments in AI technology and the EU AI Act which is now in force. The refresh will build on solid foundations in place and aims to balance innovation with regulation and trust-building measures.

The Strategy sets out a whole-of-government approach to putting the necessary enablers in place to underpin Al adoption in enterprise and public services, including the development of a supportive innovation ecosystem, a secure data and connectivity infrastructure and policies to ensure the workforce is prepared. It will require the development of new capabilities and capacities in the workforce with digital upskilling and reskilling initiatives expanded.

2024 also saw the creation of Ireland's AI Advisory Council, independent of government, made up of fourteen experts. Their recommendations, published in February 2025, Helping to Shape Ireland's AI Future, outlines the opportunities to accelerate AI adoption and reinforce Ireland's role in the global AI ecosystem.

A high-level panel of local and visiting experts will explore issues including:

- ✓ Managing the risks of Al usage

- Bridging the gap between the public and an understanding of AI
- ✓ Effective procurement to shape outcomes
- ✓ Al to support and augment human capabilities
- ✓ The impact of the digital divide
- ✓ The role of data in Al.
- Embedding AI into existing systems and business workflows
- √ The transformational benefits and opportunities
- Delivering the core principles: trustworthy, people-centred and ethical
